8:30 a.m.	Understanding the phases of a counseling process as outlined by Adler and Dreikurs. <i>Goal:</i> Participants will examine the basis of a counselor/client relationship based on the theory and practice of Alfred Adler and Rudolf Dreikurs, The four phases of a counselling process and strategies which can be effective within each phase will be outlined.

10:15 a.m.	The use of Adlerian approaches to assess the presenting problem and its relationship to the client's private logic and movement. <i>Goal:</i> Participants will investigate and practice methods of understanding a client's biased apperceptions and their purposive behaviors/choices related to the presenting problem which initiated counseling.

1:00 p.m.	Working with life tasks as an effective assessment and treatment strategy. <i>Goal:</i> Participants will explore their own relationship with the five life tasks (problems) outlined by Adler and Dreikurs. Love/intimate relationships, work, self, social and spirituality provide a holistic picture of one's life and one's movement to balance them effectively. Application of this tool in counselling relationships will be discussed.

1:30 p.m.	Focusing on the concept of embeddedness through the use of birth stories. <i>Goal:</i> Participants will explore their personal birth story to become aware of how early childhood stories influence the scripts we create for life. A birth story captures the client's earliest perception of their relationship with others and the world.

3:15 p.m.	Counseling Demonstration <i>Goal:</i> Participants will observe the use of a number of Adlerian principles and strategies to ensure a holistic and encouraging lens throughout the counseling process. Highlights of the 2-day course will be captured in a summary of content and presented throughout the course.

With a Master in Education (Counseling) and a Master in Social Work (Direct Intervention), she specializes in family, individual and couples therapy.
